



# WEST CHESTER BAYARD RUSTIN HIGH SCHOOL

**COMMUNITY PROFILE-** The West Chester Area School District covers a 75-square-mile suburban area in central Chester County, Pennsylvania, approximately 25 miles southwest of Philadelphia and 12 miles north of Wilmington, Delaware. The district is comprised of the West Chester Borough and seven surrounding townships. The area is known for its many diverse businesses and beautiful historic countryside. The student population of approximately 12,050 is served by three high schools, three middle schools, and ten elementary schools.

**SCHOOL PROFILE-** A four-year comprehensive high school and the newest of the district's three high schools, Rustin has received the Governor's Award for Excellence in Academics and the Pennsylvania Keystone Achievement Award for its commitment to academic success. **Newsweek, U.S. News and World Report, Philadelphia Magazine, and other local and national publications consistently rate the school as one of the top public highschools, locally, regionally, and nationally.**

**ENROLLMENT-** Total enrollment at Rustin High School for the 2022-23 school year is approximately 1,216 students with a professional staff of 116. Enrollment for the Class of 2023 is approximately 318 students.

**CURRICULUM:** Reflecting the district's commitment to meeting the needs of all students, the core courses of language arts, math, science and social studies are aligned to the Pennsylvania Standards. Advanced Placement (AP™) courses are offered in all of the core disciplines.

Connected by wireless technology, interactive white boards, laptops, and iPads are integrated throughout the curriculum to create a dynamic learning environment.

World language courses include French, German, Italian, Latin and Spanish from basic through advanced levels. A wide variety of elective courses are offered in business, marketing, music, art, family and consumer sciences, and technology education.

**EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS-** In order to provide educational programs that fulfill the unique needs of seniors, students who meet certain criteria are eligible to participate in the following educational options.

- **Dual Enrollment Program:** Seniors may earn high school and college credits by enrolling in courses at local colleges and universities.
- **Blended Learning:** This is a dynamic learning format that allows students to experience courses where they interact with the curriculum partially at school and partially through the online delivery- of content and instruction.
- **Career Exploration Program:** Seniors may explore future career choices by participating in an internship, externship, or job shadowing.
- **Cyber Program:** Beginning in the 2020-21 school year, our top-ranked education program will be available online for students in grades K through 12, providing a high quality, personalized, flexible education that fits the needs our students and families.

**MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS-** A total of 23.8 credits and a completed graduation project are required for graduation.

Due to the global impact of COVID-19, during the 2019-2020 school year Rustin High School provided virtual learning for students from March 2020 through the end of the school year. Standard grading policies remained in effect for the 3rd marking period. Students earned a satisfactory or unsatisfactory grade during the 4th marking period OR students were able to opt to have their 4th marking period grades calculated into their final averages. During the 2020-2021 school year, Rustin High School provided virtual learning for all student through the 1st marking period. A hybrid (in person and virtual) model was adapted beginning in the 2nd marking period through the 3rd marking period. Students were 100% in person during the 4th marking period. Families were provided a choice between in person learning or virtual learning. The minimum grade issued to students was adjusted to; 1st marking period: 65, 2nd marking period: 60; 3rd marking period: 60, 4th marking period: 60 to support students' needs during the pandemic. Standard grading policies will be followed during the 2022-2023 school year, as noted in this document.
