

WCASD Elementary Sample Cyber Schedule

K-1st Grade

Task	Sample Details This schedule is designed to give parents a suggested structure for the school day. Live (synchronous) instruction is noted in orange . The rest of this sample school day is flexible, (asynchronous) recorded instruction and work.
Morning Meeting	The Cyber teacher will complete an attendance check-in and explain the student learning plan for the day.
Reading Workshop	<p>Shared Reading and Reading Response: The Cyber teacher will read the mentor text “Butterflies for Kiri” by Cathryn Falwell while modeling the reading comprehension strategy, making connections. After listening to the story, students will write about their personal connections with the main character.</p> <p>Foundations: The Cyber teacher will review the letter sounds /u/, /k/, /v/, and /r/ and the digraphs /wh/, /sh/, /ch/, /th/, and /ck/. After, students will practice writing CVC words.</p> <p>Read to Self: Students will read an independent level text focusing on the reading comprehension strategy, making connections.</p>
Brain Break!	Brain Break with <u>Go Noodle</u>: Dance, Dance, Dance!
Writing Workshop	Independent Writing and Author’s Chair: Students will continue writing about a Community Helper. Students will share their final copy on Seesaw.

Math Workshop	<p>Small Group Instruction: The Cyber teacher will complete a small group lesson on counting money. Students will use hands-on manipulatives, including place value blocks and coins.</p> <p>Math Review: The Cyber teacher will provide review and practice with subtraction within 100 using the counting back and place value chart strategies. After, students will practice both strategies by solving 3 subtraction problems.</p> <p>Independent Practice & Student Choice:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Freckle Practice: Coin Counting Review: Students will go on a scavenger hunt, looking around their house or outside to find real-life examples of 3-D shapes: cone, cube, sphere, cylinder, as well as rectangular and triangular prisms.
Physical Education	Jump Rope: Students will practice jump rope skills. The Cyber gym teacher will review healthy food and heart smart choices.
Social Studies	Landmarks and Monuments: Students will identify and describe landmarks and monuments including the Lincoln Memorial and Washington Monument, as well as Mount Rushmore.
