

Stetson PIAA Sports Registration FAQ

Q: What paperwork do I need for my child to participate in a PIAA sport?

A: Here are the requirements:

- Your child must obtain a physical with the results recorded on the proper PIAA form (Sections 1-7 for the initial exam – wrestling also requires Section 10). Below is a link to the form.

- The physical must occur **on or after June 1 preceding the school year of participation**. (Ex. – A physical obtained on or after 6/01/22 would be valid for the entire 2022-2023 school year.)
- The physical form must be **signed** and **dated** by a physician.
- The **physician's license number** must be provided on the form.
- The physical form must be uploaded to Family ID. Instructions are linked below.

- In addition to the PIAA physical, all athletes must have taken a baseline concussion test while at Stetson.

Q: Can I just send the paper physical into school instead of uploading to Family ID?

A: No. The form must be uploaded to Family ID.

Q: My child received a physical exam, but the results were not recorded on the official PIAA form. Is this acceptable?

A: No. The physical exam results must be recorded on the proper form at the time of the exam.

Q: I cannot schedule a physical before a tryout date for a PIAA sport. Is my child still allowed to try out?

A: No. A valid PIAA physical is required to try out. There are places that specialize in sports physicals and take rush appointments if you cannot get one with your family physician.

Q: My child receives an annual physical before June 1 every year. Is this physical valid for PIAA sports in the following school year?

A: No. The PIAA physical must be dated on or after June 1 preceding the school year of participation.

Q: What if my child plans to play a PIAA sport in more than one season?

A: The PIAA physical is valid for the entire school year. However, for each additional season, parents must register students on Family ID for the specific sport and upload Section 8 of the PIAA form (see the link above). Section 8 does not require a doctor's visit. Section 9 must also be completed if significant injury has occurred since the date of the original PIAA physical.

Q: How can my child obtain a baseline concussion test?

A: If your child has been at Stetson since the beginning of 6th grade, a concussion test has likely been administered already. If your child does need a test, the athletic director will schedule a round of testing prior to fall, winter, and spring sports seasons for any student who needs one.

Q: My child took a concussion test at Stetson in 6th grade. Is another concussion test necessary to play a PIAA sport in 7th or 8th grade?

A: No. Any baseline concussion test taken at Stetson in any grade is valid for the student's subsequent time at Stetson.
